The meetings were held in the Moreno family's tiny yard. Their seven children helped put three rough boards across boulders for folks to sit on. Most of the people stood for lack of space. My accordian squeezed out happy tunes as families approached in the dark. Roger preached by candlelight.

We fondly refer to this work as the church "God built". Yes, He's builds them all, but this work distinctivly proves His hand. For within one year there was a lovely building with electricy. Neatly painted pews, replaced those makeshift planks. Only the neighborhood dogs and chickens couldn't detect the difference. For they frequently sauntered in thinking it was still merely the Moreno's patch of yard. But God deemed it holy ground and so did His people who filled its walls. God called a national pastor to care for this flock. We left it in Pastor Molina's capable hands in 1985. Roger & I went on to Ecuador for 12 years. We just received this email:

Dear Brother Roger and Sister Dianne, Receive codial greetings from Pastor Molina and The Moreno family. We haven't communicated with you because we lost your address.

Today we found your web site and have happily located you. We have so much news to catch up on. Please know we always remember you with much love and warmth in Christ. Write us all about your news.
